Is there any time requirement?

Only that the grade-specific requirements need to be completed while in the respective grade level.

Must the answers be submitted?

Any knowledgeable parent, Scout leader, group leader, priest, religious or catechist.

Father Capodanno Activity Patch

In the church calendar, some have the title of "Saint" and are venerated by the universal church. Others are venerated by the local church and are designated "Blessed." Lastly, those whom the Church has deemed worthy of consideration for sainthood are given the title "Servant of God." This activity patch honors Servant of God Father Vincent Capodanno. His words, deeds, and devotion to prayer and sacraments have inspired countless American Catholics, especially those serving in the military. His life and work have had a lasting impact on the American Catholic landscape.

Requirements for Father Vincent Capodanno Activity Patch

1st thru 5th Grades - Complete 5 requirements and 2 activities.

6th thru 12th Grades - Complete 6 requirements and 3 activities.

Requirements:

- 1) What is the title of a book written about Father Capodanno's life?
- 2) What is unique about the ship, FF-1093, that bears Father Capodanno's name?
- 3) What was Father Capodanno attempting to do when he died?
- 4) What step in becoming a saint was Father Capodanno declared in 2006?
- 5) What U.S. Navy rank did Father Capodanno hold?
- 6) Each September, the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA celebrates an annual Mass for the repose of Father Capodanno's soul. Where does this take place?

Activities:

- 1) View the short video found at https://www.milarch.org/father-capodanno/. Why do you think Father Capodanno was recommended for both the Medal of Honor and for canonization (i.e., sainthood)?
- 2) Visit the AMS Vocations webpage, read the information, and watch the short film there: https://www.milarch.org/vocations/. What are the qualifications for a military chaplain? How do they differ from other priests?
- 3) Identify a Catholic military veteran who has served overseas. Ask them about their experience with chaplains or Mass while deployed.
