1) There was a shortage of trained nurses and battlefield hospital sanitation conditions were horrible. Catholic Sisters were among the most trained in nursing techniques during this time.

Is there any time requirement?

Only that the grade-specific requirements need to be completed while in the respective grade level.

Civil War Catholic Sister Nurses Activity Patch

This activity honors those men and women who led heroic lives of faith. Their words, deeds, and devotion to prayer and sacraments inspire all American Catholics. In the U.S. church calendar, some are honored as “saints” and are venerated by the universal church. Some are called “blessed” and are venerated by a local church. Some are called “venerable” and, while on the way to being recognized as a “saint”, may be venerated by Catholics. Most of these men and women lived and worked in either North or South America. Many lived in what is now the United States. Others never set foot there; however, their lives and work had a huge impact on the Catholic American landscape. All of them sought to follow Jesus.

Requirements for Civil War Catholic Sister Nurses Activity Patch

All – Read about Catholic Sisters who served as nurses during the U.S. Civil War. Resources are provided throughout.

1st thru 5th Grades - Complete five requirements and two activities.

6th thru 12th Grades - Complete six requirements and three activities.

Requirements:

- 1) At the outbreak of the Civil War and as the War progressed, there was a great need for Catholic Sisters to care for the wounded. Why?
- 2) Many Catholic Sisters answered the call to help. Name three Religious Orders that served as Civil War nurses.
- 3) Besides working near the battlelines, where else did the Catholic Sisters serve the wounded? Why was this work important?
- 4) What changes did the Catholic Sisters make in the hospitals that made a significant improvement in healthcare? What lasting effect did these changes have?
- 5) The Catholic Sisters served soldiers from both the Union and Confederate armies, and anyone else who was injured. What challenges did they face during the War?
- 6) These courageous Catholic Sisters were the forerunners of which military organization serving today?

Activities:

- 1) Many Catholic Sisters continue to serve the sick today. Look up one order that served during the Civil War and continues to serve the sick today.
